"Built environment: rural roots and urban influences-India lives in its villages. Approximately eighty percent of India's population is rural; spread over half a million villages. Rural houses, in contrast to urban houses, are built on line evolved over thousands of years of aesthetic traditions, indigenous techniques and judicious use of the local materials such as mud, grass, bamboo, cane. Palm and coconut leaves predominate in the rural habitat in the lush green South India, while stone and sand create or adorn houses in vast desert areas of Northwest Kutch. Their design makes great ecological sense because of the use of renewable materials and great aesthetic sense because of its being in harmony with the natural surroundings.

The houses and the spaces in and around are arranged to suit the local climate. The Kutch desert houses for example are built with thick walls and small openings and narrow passages between the houses to overcome the gale of strong winds, the dust and the heat".
